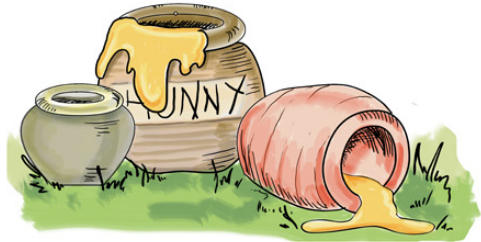




"100 Acre Wood, Forest Friends"

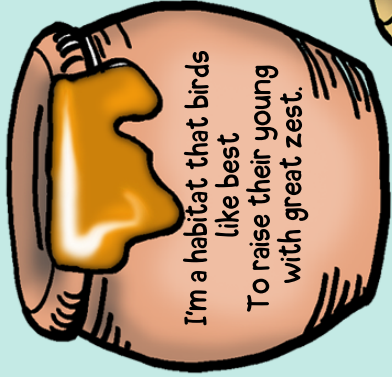

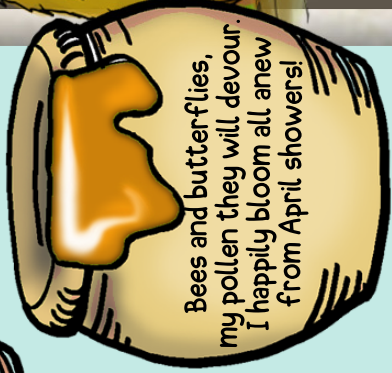

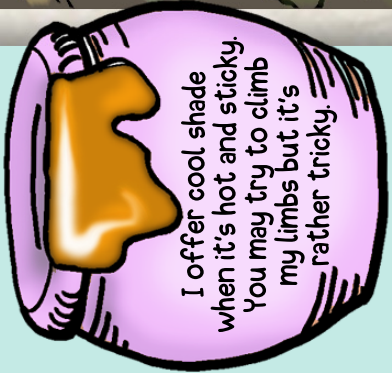
