- Main house at Muscoot farm has been renovated
- Main house at Lasdon Park n Arboretum has been renovated.
- Westchester's Winter Wonderland went off without a hitch in its 10th year. Attendance was great 22,000 cars and our Parks staff worked alongside the Parks Foundation to set up and take down for the event in a way that gets more streamlined every year.
